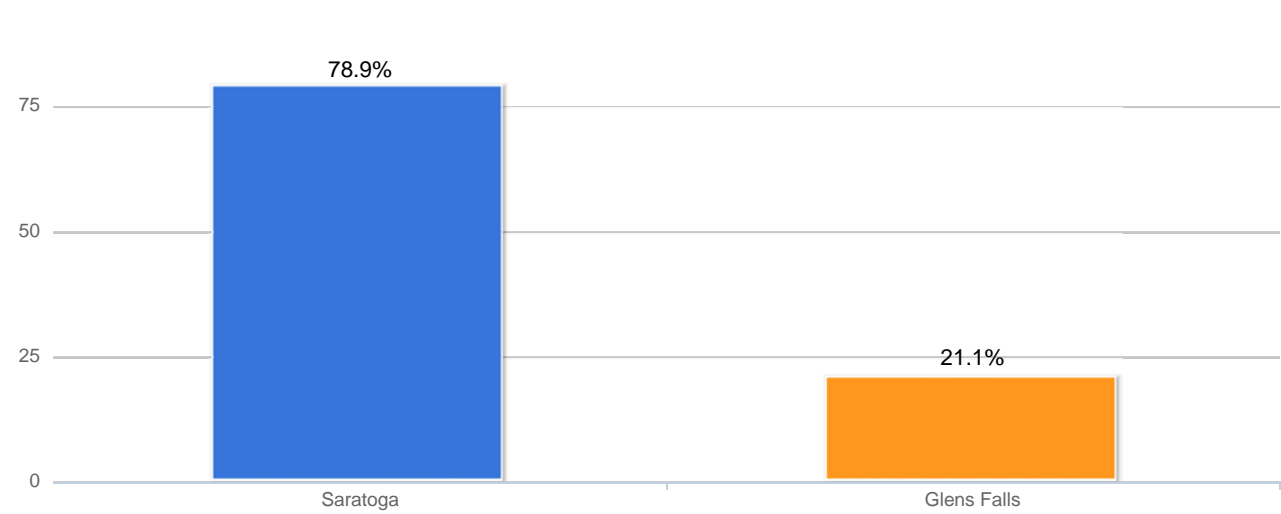

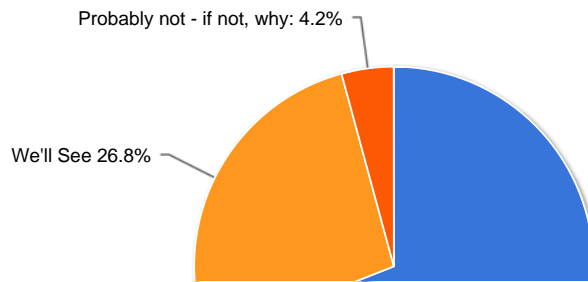

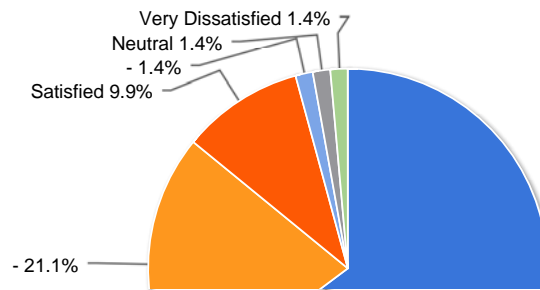

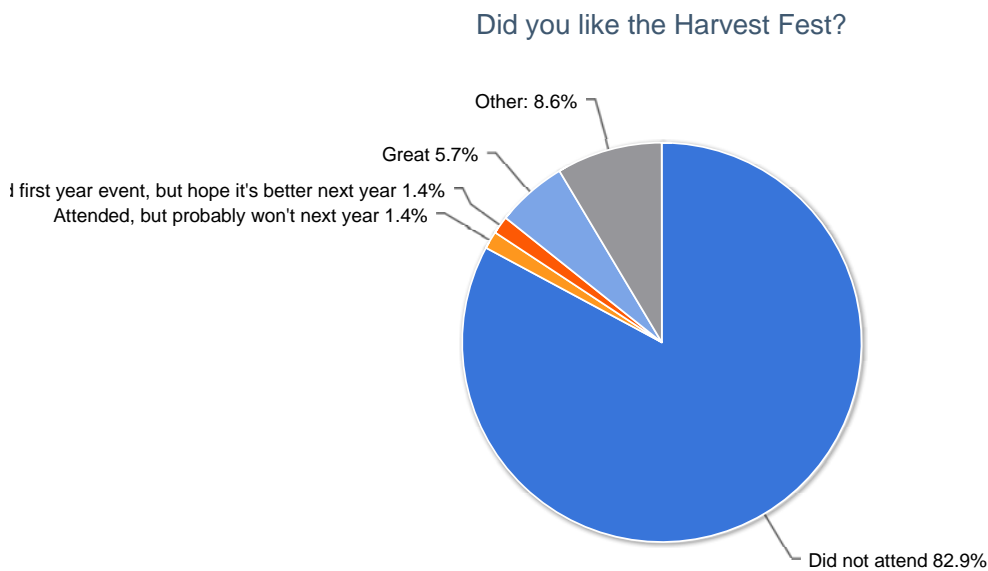

1	It was pretty easy this year. If you have done it before it would be nice if you did not have to wait to talk to a person to check your name off at the beginning of the season.	
1	It runs smoothly the way it is. I would prefer to have a choice of the item of the week if you are offering separate ones to the Micro Share vs Full Share.	
1	On the website, having a clearly and prominently placed link to email the CSA chair (person in charge) would be helpful. It can be within the "CSA" section, but would make communication easier, like if you were going to miss a week and wanted to double up the week after, for instance.	
1	Keep the year-long share available -- loved that. Also, we love Wednesday market! Wish there could be Wed market all year. I liked how the required item was always on the table by the sign-in. Overall, the CSA experience is quite easy. Thanks!	
1	Don't get rid of the vacation weeks- these are key for me. The only reasons I would hesitate to sign up again are 1) my family is shrinking 2) a part of me would like to spread my support to more farms. Nothing that reflects on you guys, you're great, I just like the idea of farmer support.

1	Although I thought the IDEA of the bags was very good, I didn't in particular like the bag itself. It shedded continually and seemed to be biodegrading before my eyes. Keep doing bags though. I can't always come in a tee-shirt as i come from work.
1	I love the burlap tote bags--We hang it on the door--so much easier than searching for a tee shirt
1	Aside from home delivery of veggies that we pick out ourselves each week, I can't think of anything! It's pretty darn easy as long as you can get yourself to the market :)
1	It is very easy already - maybe allowing seconds as a part of your offering for canning at a CSA perk rate
1	If you get to market too late sometimes the pickins are slim - maybe people could preorder a box.
1	I don't think there are too many ways to improve on the service you already provide! I just had the one suggestion (above) and if you have any tips/tricks to storing things for longer shelf-life (or quick preserving methods) I'm all ears. Otherwise, thanks for what you already do!
1	We won't be here, but if we were I don't know how you'd improve it. I thought it was very easy.
1	Bigger print on the cards as to the amounts CSA members can take. I have to put reading glasses on. Really, it took me a while to think of this. So I'm pretty content.
1	I never received a brochure or any instructions when I signed up for the fall share. Also an email reminder that the CSA share starts more in advace would be nice. We received an email friday night (after I had checked my email for the day) that the CSA started tomorrow.
1	I would like the mandatory item for the micro to be the same as for the bigger share, sometimes that was confusing
1	more consistent signage for what exactly the CSA members get in a share. Some items changed in value from week to week and some were not signed.

1	It seemed like occasionally there would be something that was supposed to be offered and wasn't. Gives me the feeling that Saratoga gets the goods if there aren't enough for both. Might not be the case but it seems that way. If so, GF should get a discount.
1	There is not quite enough of a difference between a full and half share. Perhaps the full share could include one more item for the price?
1	How about a choice of the "must take" - sometimes the micro share had an item I could have used vs the Full share - but I had to take the full share item
1	If you are considering new crops, please consider tomatillos and more sweet Charentais melons, and consider doing a weekly dozen egg CSA (at a discounted price if possible).
