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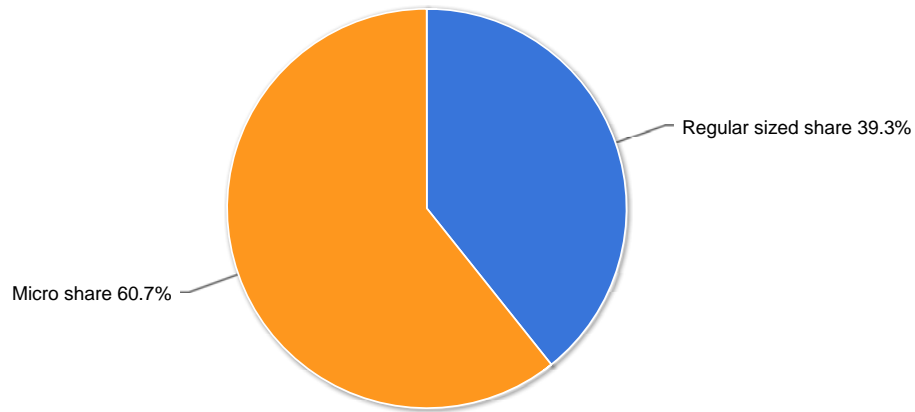

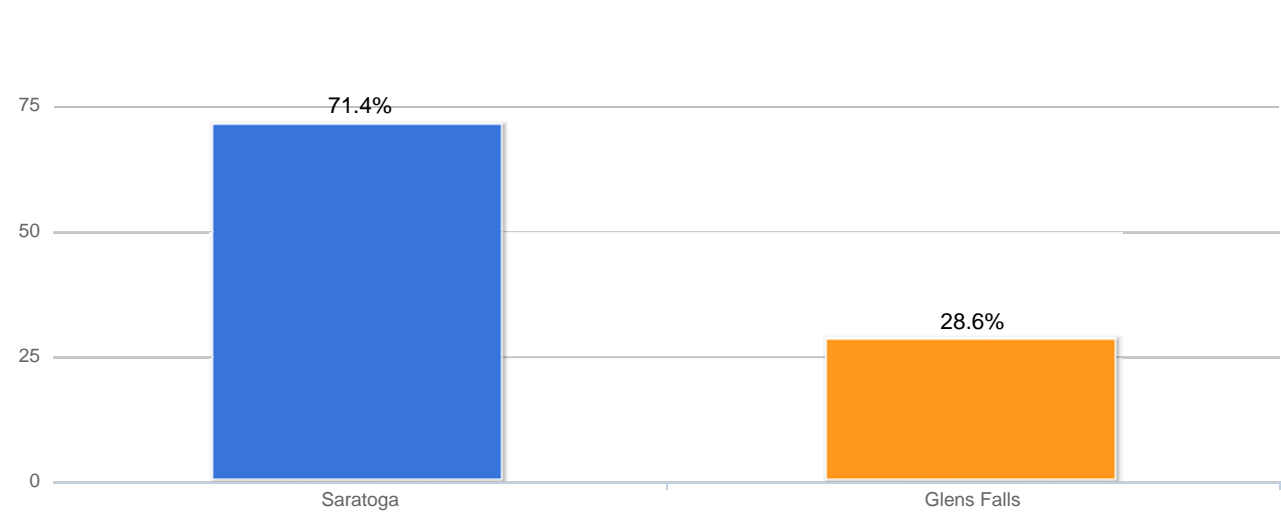

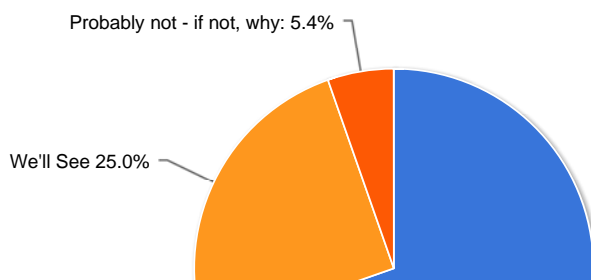

Do you plan on joining again next year?



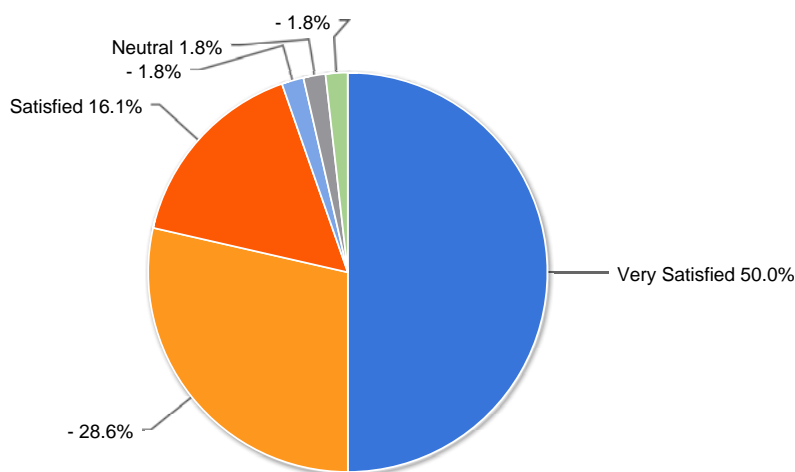

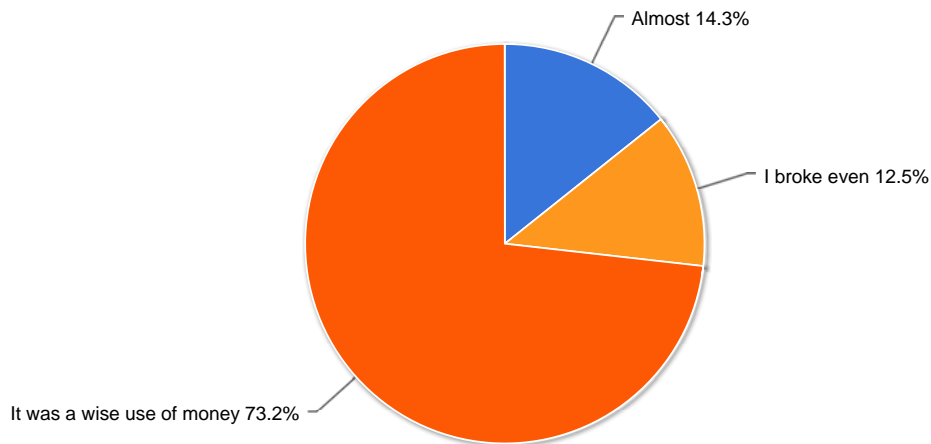

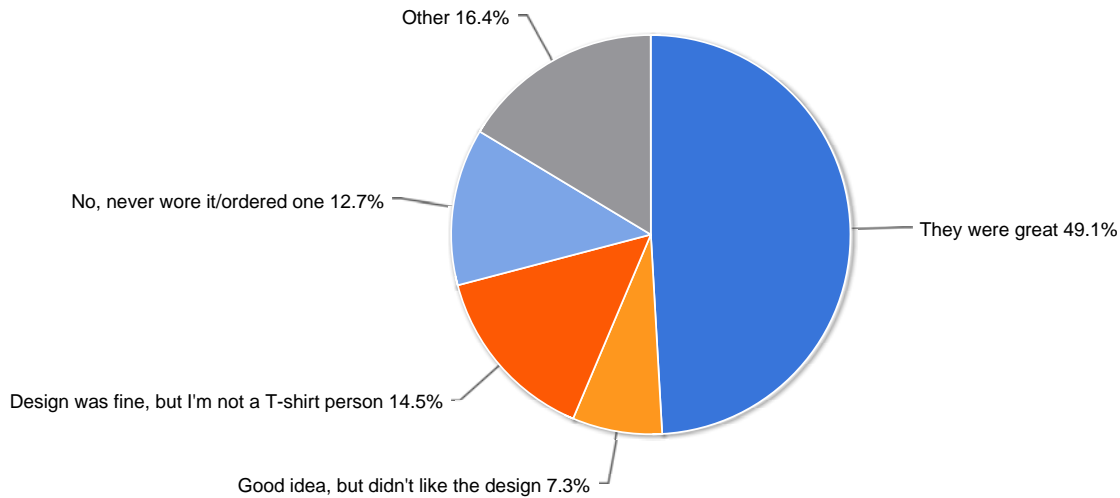

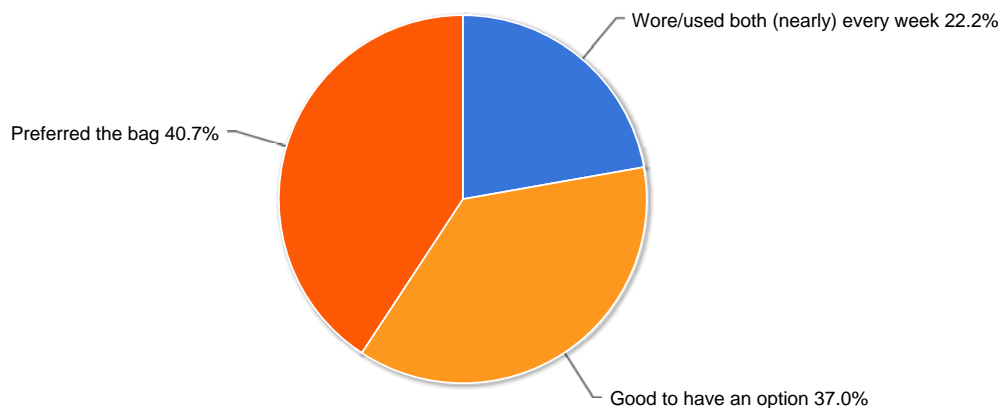

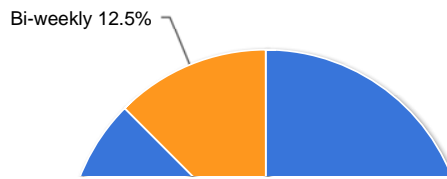

How often do you read the farm's email?

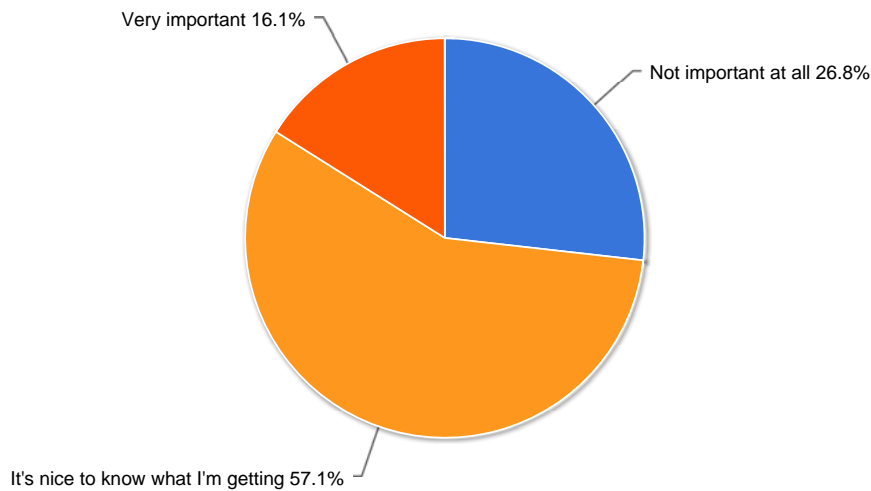

1	Burlap bag sheds fuzzy fibers that are hard to get off the food. Great idea but can be frustrating to have to remove fuzzies from the food. We love that you have farm events. We will definitely attend when our kids get older.	
1	This year was much better than last year. The bags were a great idea. The share value was more reasonable. Overall, I was much happier with the CSA. I was fairly unhappy with last summers CSA (before the hurricane) but this year was much better.	
1	How about a farm hat rather than a t-shirt? Also, I'd be willing to pay a little for a better bag....	
1	The reusable bag was great and I understand the reason for choosing that one (compostable, eco-friendly), however, I found that it often left tiny fibers/hairs all over the food. It would also be nice to be able to wash the bag after using it each week.	
1	This was my first taste of the CSA program. My goal was to get my family to eat healthier and we did that. The easy sign-in process and picking out your own products each week makes me feel like I am a part of the farm -- like an owner. The occasional "free" item was a great surprise. I am hooked and certainly would like to continue in the program for many more years. I also enjoyed picking up new recipes through your e-mails. I followed Erika's suggestion and made Tomato Jam. My family loved it and their only concern was that I did not make enough to last through the winter!
